Where did summer go?! It has been a very busy start to the year for everyone at Harbison.

This year will see five major changes to Australian aged care: 24/7 Registered Nurses in all homes from 1 July, a national average of 200 minutes of care time per resident per day from 1 October, new quality standards to replace the standards introduced in 2019, new governance standards from 1 December, and a wage increase for aged care workers employed under modern awards from 30 June.

Harbison supports higher pay for aged care workers and is currently negotiating a new enterprise agreement with our workforce. At the time of writing, the Government has indicated that it will not fully fund the increase in minimum award rates from 30 June.

Fortunately, Harbison already has 24/7 Registered Nurses in each home, so that reform will not affect us directly (but it will add to the current global shortage of skilled and experienced aged care nurses).

Unfortunately, the combination of minimum care minutes from October and the potentially unfunded wage increase from June will increase pressure on an already strained budget.

Harbison is proud to be the last residential aged care provider in the Southern Highlands which does not charge residents additional care fees. Approximately 40% of current residents pay nothing or a reduced rate for their accommodation. For many years we have provided a range of care and services that exceed the basics required under the Aged Care Act. We have exciting plans to further expand the options available to residents when circumstances allow.

Harbison aims to be an employer of choice in the Southern Highlands and a place where people can realise their dreams and full potential. Our workforce is our most important asset, and we must be able to reinvest in them to ensure our residents enjoy the highest possible quality of life. We hope the Government will follow through on pre-election promises to fully fund increased minimum rates of pay.

As always, we will keep everyone informed as the pace of reform speeds up. Meanwhile, know that there is a lot of work going on behind the scenes to ensure that Harbison is ready for these changes and the changes which will inevitably follow. **DAVID COCHRAN**

SOUTHERN HIGHLANDS COMMUNITY HOSPICE AND HARBISON CARE PARTNERSHIP



The first group of volunteers to train, Harbison Care CEO David Cochran and PACCS presenter Bronwyn Heron You might have noticed a few friendly faces around the Moss Vale and Burradoo sites wearing badges saying, "Southern Highlands Community Hospice Palliative Care Volunteer".

The Southern Highlands Community Hospice (SHCH) has been contributing regular funding to Harbison for the last two years and is now providing volunteers to support our residents. SHCH was established in July 2010 as a charitable organisation, to provide hospice and palliative care services for the Southern Highlands community.

The focus of the charity is to fund a range of services that will enable compassionate support for people of the Southern Highlands Community requiring palliative care. The funding provides much needed support for pharmaceuticals, equipment and In-Home Care, including nursing and carer support. Funds are provided through individual applications or in partnership with local organisations and providers.

SHCH has a partnership agreement with Harbison to provide funds for additional palliative care nursing and medications. Palliative Aged Care Consultancy Services (PACCS) provides the additional specialist nursing. This includes patient assessment, management, and care tailored to meet the needs of people diagnosed with chronic end-stage medical conditions. They have also provided the palliative care training for the SHCH volunteers at Harbison.



Group 2 Palliative Care Volunteers starting in January 2023

In 2022 SHCH provided \$94,591.18 to the residents of Harbison. These funds supported palliative care medications, additional specialist nursing and the purchase of four much needed syringe drivers to deliver medications

The first group of Palliative Care volunteers also started in 2022 supporting residents with one- on-one visits, with another group to begin in January 2023.



Southern Highlands Community Hospice is underpinned by a dynamic team of over 70 Volunteers, some working in the profitable retail outlet Timeless in Bowral, others as Palliative Care Volunteers at Harbison Care or as part of the Biography Team.

SHCH funds are raised through our retail outlet Timeless, Bowral, and through fundraiser functions throughout the year. Generous donations of quality furniture and fashion stock the shop and volunteers and SHCH members ensure the smooth running of the charity's ventures.

SHCH also provides a free biography service that documents the client and their families' memories, photographs and stories. These high quality, complimentary publications are compiled by trained volunteer Biographers and are presented to the families when completed. Harbison Resident Advisory Committee Meeting Minutes - 17th February 2023

Location: Moss Vale Chapel


CEO welcomed everyone to the meeting at 11.05am and thanked them for participating in the committee. The meeting discussed the following issues:

- Recent inconsistency in the meal service at both sites members informed the CEO of several recent examples where the usual high standards had not been met for both homes. The Residential Services Manager will investigate.
- The meeting heard about work to implement the "Getting the dining experience right" guidelines issued in August 2022. More information will be provided to residents.
- A suggestion was received about implementing a dress code for residents in the public areas. The Leisure & Lifestyle Manager will ask residents what they think in one of the monthly surveys.
- The meeting informed the CEO that residents want to know who the RN In-charge is for each shift. The Clinical Care Managers will consider this request.
- The meeting discussed in general the ongoing shortage of skilled and experienced healthcare workers in Australia. The CEO explained that Harbison has a workforce strategy aimed at making Harbison an employer of choice.
- The meeting raised the issue of window cleaning. The Residential Services Manager will provide information about the cleaning schedule to residents.
- The meeting raised a concern about Australia Day celebrations this year. The CEO explained that Australia Day has become a sensitive topic but agreed to pass the feedback to the Leisure & Lifestyle Manager.
- The meeting heard that a Biography Program is offered by the Palliative Care Volunteers, which compliments the Life Story Program run by Harbison. Residents who are interested in either program should contact the Leisure & Lifestyle Manager, Janice Young.

The meeting discussed the recent internet outage which impacted Moss Vale for three days. The CEO acknowledged that communication between residents and their friends and families was impacted and explained that learnings from the experience would be used to improve the Harbison Business Continuity Plan.

- The meeting asked how surveys are used. The CEO explained that trends are identified and used to plan improvements, but that not every suggestion can be actioned. The Residential Services Manager will be asked to consider how to improve sharing information about survey outcomes.
- The meeting considered a suggestion to rotate books in the library to ensure books on higher shelves are accessible. The Leisure & Lifestyle Manager will consider the suggestion.
- The meeting considered a suggestion to coordinate happy hour with live music events. The CEO agreed and will refer the suggestion to the Leisure & Lifestyle Manager.
- The meeting considered a concern about a section of Moss Vale garden which did not appear to be receiving routine maintenance. The Maintenance Manager will investigate.
- The meeting discussed case conferences, and suggested that residents be reminded about when they are offered (on admission, on significant change in care needs, at end-of-life, annually, and on request).
- The meeting heard that a Harbison Playgroup will be established at Moss Vale soon, following the success of the program at Burradoo.
- CEO confirmed that there is no set date to demolish the Burradoo hostel now that the last resident has moved out.
- CEO explained that all residents are welcome to participate in the committee, either as members or casual participants. In accordance with new governance requirements which apply from December 2023 all new residents will be invited to participate and all residents will be reminded at least annually about the committee. The CEO hopes the committee will continue the practice of hosting the Board Chair at a meeting at least once a year, and sending a representative to a Board meeting at least once a year, and will have the opportunity to provide written advice to the Board from December 2023.
- The meeting voted to meet quarterly in 2023.
- The meeting approved the minutes of the last committee meeting held on 28 September 2022.
- The CEO thanked the members for their participation and valuable feedback, and acknowledged Heather Sharwood for collating feedback from other residents to ensure their views were represented in the discussions.
- The meeting closed at 12:07pm
